Why did Jesus have to die?

Bible Verse

"Christ died for sins once and for all time. The One who did what is right died for those who don't do right. He died to bring you to God." 1 Peter 3:18 Jesus died and rose again so that you can become a member of God's family.

Session Goals

- 1. PARTICIPATE in telling the story of Jesus' death and resurrection.
- 2. TALK ABOUT God's plan for us.
- 3. THANK God for sending Jesus to make a way for us to be forgiven of our sins and become members of God's family.
- 4. CHOOSE to be forgiven and become a member of God's family, as the Holy Spirit leads.

Spark Principle—Transformation

Transformations occur when something new is introduced to an existing object and changes the object. Jesus changes us.



Cross

For centuries, the shape of the cross has reminded people of the sacrifice Jesus made by dying on a wooden cross for our sins. When you see a

cross, you can remember that Jesus died and that He rose again! Jesus died and rose again so that we can become members of God's family.

Today we come to the greatest of all events. We were created to be companions of the Father, but sin separated us from God. Christ died on the cross to make a way for us to get back to God. He paid the wages of sin with His own life, that we might be brought into fellowship with the Father. Listen to His prayer: "Father, forgive them. They don't know what they are doing" (Luke 23:34). This is the only way an unholy people can approach a holy God.

Others have died for a good cause, but the grave was the end. Jesus Christ rose again the third day according to the Scriptures. He appeared to Mary Magdalene (John 20:11–18), the other women (Matthew 28:1,8–10), Peter (1 Corinthians 15:5) and the disciples on the way to Emmaus (Luke 24:13–35).

What effect did all these appearances have on the disciples? They knew in whom they believed; they knew that He had conquered death and that He was a risen Master and Lord and Savior.

The cross upon which Christ died has become the focal point of all history. The cross was the triumphant goal of Christ's life—the one thing to which He had been looking forward, not from the beginning of His earthly life, but from before time began. He is "the Lamb whose death was planned before the world was created" (Revelation 13:8). Surely salvation is God's greatest plan and His greatest miracle.

Daily Recap

At the end of each session, take time to reflect on what happened. Use these questions as a guide:

- What worked well today? Pray for the energy to finish VBS strong.
- Which children seemed interested in joining God's family? Which ones seemed to still have questions? Ask God to give you the opportunity and the words to talk further with these children.
- As you prepare for the final session of VBS, pray for each child by name. Ask God to water the seeds that were planted today.



Tell the Bible Story

Preparation: Mark Luke 22 in student's Bibles. (Optional: Use Post-it Notes to mark Bibles.) If Bibles are not available for all students, mark your Bible and ask volunteers to read verses as indicated in the story.

Bring the Bible Story to Life!

Bring in some or all of the following props, and hold them up or pass them around as described in the story: walking stick, seder plate (or any plate), olives, cross, clock, cloth or towel and a perfume bottle.

Cover a table with newspaper where you will be leading the Story Starter activity. Put on safety glasses. In sandwich-sized resealable plastic bag, place approximately 1 tablespoon of baking soda. In a snack-sized resealable plastic bag, place ¼ cup of vinegar. Blow some air into the vinegar bag, seal it and place it inside the baking-soda bag. Remove as much air as possible from the baking-soda bag and seal shut. Place on the newspaper-covered table.

Story Starter

Welcome back to SonSpark Labs! I'm glad to see you again! Today we're going to discover another one of the laws God made!

Show plastic bags and explain the contents. Place bags back on table, and smack down hard with your fist on the vinegar bag. The bag should break. Make sure the outside bag remains sealed tightly! If it pops open, quickly seal it again. Shake the two bags to mix the vinegar and baking soda, and then place bag back on the table. It will fill with gas and might even burst open!



When vinegar and baking soda mix, something new is formed: a gas called carbon dioxide. When something new is created by bringing two different things together, that's a transformation.

The most important part of God's plan for US involves transformation. WE are transformed when Jesus becomes a part of our lives and we become members of God's family. As we research this account, consider the following: What did Jesus do so that we can be transformed from lonely sinners into glad members of God's family?

The Salvation Solution Luke 22—24:35

Stranger on the Road

One day, a man named Cleopas was walking down the road with a friend. They were both people who loved Jesus. Cleopas and his friend talked as they walked toward the town of Emmaus. **Hold up walking stick.** Suddenly, a stranger joined them.

"Excuse me," said the stranger. "You seem deep in conversation. What are you talking about?"

"You must be a visitor to these parts," Cleopas answered. "Haven't you HEARD about the things that have happened in Jerusalem?"

"What things?" the stranger asked.

"Jesus of Nazareth—our friend, the One we hoped would rescue us—has been . . . KILLED!" And Cleopas reported everything that had happened during the last three days.

The Arrest and Crucifixion of Jesus

Cleopas began where we ended our story yesterday, with Jesus and His friends in danger. **Read about the danger in Luke 22:2.** The religious leaders wanted to find a way to get rid of Jesus—and maybe His friends, as well!

Jesus had gathered with His friends to eat a special meal called the Passover meal. **Show plate.** Jesus tried to tell His friends that scary things were going to happen to Him, but they STILL didn't understand

what He was saying. However, Jesus knew it was time for those things to happen, just as God had planned.

How do you think Jesus must have been feeling? How would you feel if you knew some bad things were going to happen to you?

At the end of their meal, Jesus and 11 of His friends went to a place called the Mount of Olives to pray. **Show olives.** Another friend, Judas, had made secret plans to help the religious leaders arrest Jesus. And that's exactly what happened. Soldiers came to the place where Jesus was praying and took Him away, even though He had done nothing wrong! But Jesus knew this was what God had planned.

Read what happened next in Luke 22:63–65. Pilate, the Roman governor, didn't want to put Jesus to death. He tried to talk the religious leaders and other people into letting Jesus go free. What do you think the people said? The people kept shouting loudly for Jesus to be crucified, or killed on a wooden cross. So Pilate gave them what they wanted. Even though he knew Jesus had done nothing wrong, Pilate allowed Jesus to be killed—it was all part of God's plan.

Soldiers took Jesus to a hill outside the city and nailed Him to a cross. **Show cross.** They hung a criminal on either side of Him. Jesus' followers wept as they watched Him suffer. The rulers and soldiers who had beaten Jesus sneered and made fun of Him. "If you really are the Christ, save yourself!" they yelled. No one understood that Jesus HAD to suffer these things as part of God's plan to save the world!

But Jesus understood. He knew that what He was doing was the absolutely necessary WAY to pay the price for people's sins. And He even had words of forgiveness for those who were mean to Him. **What do you think Jesus said? Read about it in Luke 23:34.** Jesus asked His Father to forgive those who had hurt Him. Jesus said, "They don't know what they are doing." Hours passed. **Show clock.** At noon, dark clouds covered the sun. Three hours later, Jesus cried out, "It is finished!" And then He died, just as God had planned.

A friend named Joseph (not Jesus' father) asked Pilate for permission to bury Jesus. **Show cloth or**



towel. Joseph wrapped the body in cloth and placed it in a nearby tomb. Some of the women who were friends of Jesus prepared spices and perfumes to anoint His body. **Show perfume bottle.**

Confusion at the Empty Tomb

When those same women returned to the tomb on Sunday morning, they found an astounding surprise! The massive stone that had sealed the tomb was rolled away. Jesus' body was GONE. And while they were wondering about this, what did they see? **Read Luke 24:4–8 to find out.** Jesus is alive!

The women were so happy! They turned and ran from the tomb to tell Jesus' friends. But they did not believe the women—it just didn't make any sense!

Still, some of Jesus' friends ran to the tomb to make sure that what the women had said was true. And the tomb was EMPTY! But where was Jesus? Was He ALIVE—or had someone stolen His body?

The Encounter Resumed

When Cleopas finished his story, the stranger spoke. "Don't you understand that Jesus HAD to suffer all those things?" He began to explain how it was God's plan for Jesus to suffer, die and rise from the dead.

Skit **Option**

As a fun alternative or supplement to this Bible story, ask leaders, youth helpers or other volunteers to perform "Stranger on the Road" Bible story skit in ShowTime! Assemblies.

There was no other way people's sins could be forgiven; there was no other way to end the separation caused by sin so that people could be close to God!

Cleopas and his friend were amazed at the stranger's words. They begged the stranger to stay and eat with them. When the stranger gave God thanks for the food, the men

suddenly realized that the stranger was Jesus Himself! He WAS alive! But as soon as they recognized Him, He disappeared. The two friends were SO excited, they hurried RIGHT back to Jerusalem to tell the others the incredible news! Jesus was ALIVE! Everything had happened—just as God had planned.

Conclusion

Hold up glass with the experiment preserved (or recreated) from Session 2. Remember this experiment? What did the top clear layer represent? (God.) What did the bottom red layer represent? (Adam and Eve. Us.) In the beginning, Adam and **Eve were close to God. Then what happened?** (Sin separated Adam and Eve from God.) That sin is represented in our glass by the middle blue layer.

Since that time, everyone has been separated from God. We all sin. But our sin hasn't ruined God's plan. Today's Daily Plan is "God's Plan: 2 SAVE Us!" Jesus suffered and died to bring us to God. He is the only One who could take the punishment for our sins so that we could be forgiven and be with God forever. Watch. This is like what can happen to our sins because Jesus died on the cross. Carefully pour bleach down inside of glass. It will slowly bleach the blue color between the layers.

Our Bible verse for today, 1 Peter 3:18, says, "Christ died for sins once and for all time. The One who did what is right died for those who don't do right. He died to bring you to God." Because Jesus died and rose again, our sins can be forgiven. And that is the most important part of God's awesome plan for you!

When you believe that Jesus is God's Son who died and rose again so that you could be forgiven, you can become

a member of God's family and live with Him now and forever. You are no longer separated from God! Invite preteens interested in knowing more about becoming members of God's family to talk with you or another leader after class. See "Leading a Child to Christ" (p.1).

Prayer

Let's take time to pray silently. If you are part of God's family, thank Jesus for making that possible. If you are not part of God's family, thank Him for loving you enough to die and live again so you can be forgiven and join His family. Give kids a minute or two to pray. Close by thanking God that we can be forgiven and join His family because of what Jesus did for us.



Apply the Bible Story

Bible Story Review

To review the Bible Story, lead preteens to complete "Why Did Jesus Have to Die?" activity on page 14 of the *Lab Journal*. As they work, ask these questions to quide the conversation:

- What happened on the Mount of Olives where Jesus went to pray? (Jesus was arrested.)
- Why didn't Jesus stop the people who lied about Him and hurt Him? (Jesus knew it was part of God's plan. He was willing to let everything happen according to God's plan so that we can become members of God's family.)
- How did Jesus' friends feel when He died? (Sad. Scared. Confused.) What made their feelings change? (Knowing Jesus was alive again.)
- What are some of the reasons we are glad that Jesus is alive? (Because Jesus died and rose from the dead, we can become members of God's family. Jesus made a way for us to be forgiven of our sins and be close to God as Adam and Eve were in the beginning.)

The question in today's Q&A is "Why did Jesus have to die?" After hearing our story, how would you answer that question? Volunteers respond. The Q&A answer is "Jesus died and rose again so that you can become a member of God's family." That's a promise from God to you, me and everyone! Jesus' dying and rising from the dead is the most IMPORTANT thing that ever happened. It's the reason our lives can be TRANSFORMED!

Active Review

Preteens form groups of three or four. Give each group a penny. At your signal, a member of each group flips the penny. Groups whose coins land heads up answer one of the questions above. Continue, taking turns to flip coins and answer until all questions are answered.

God's Plan for Me (Life Application)

Today's Bible verse is 1 Peter 3:18. Volunteer reads verse aloud from Bible. Who does this verse say Jesus died for? (Those who don't do right.) Who is that? (Everyone.) We all sin. We have all chosen to do what isn't right. But Jesus made a way for us to be forgiven! He took the punishment for our sin so that we can be in God's family.

Preteens complete "Bridging the Gap" activity on page 15 of the *Lab Journal*. Ask questions such as the following:

- When Jesus lived on Earth, how did He show God's love? What things did Jesus do that no one else can do? (Fed people. Healed sick and hurt people. Showed His power over nature. Died on the cross and rose again.)
- How does Jesus show His love for us today? (Forgives our sins. Promises always to be with us and help us. Hears and answers our prayers.)
- What can we do to thank Jesus for laying down His life for us? (Accept His offer to take the punishment for our sins. Believe in His death and resurrection. Accept His forgiveness.)

What part of God's plan are we talking about today? Pause for preteens to respond, "2 SAVE Us!" This is the most important and TRANSFORMATIVE part of God's plan. That's why our formula for this plan is GP4U = J! It's all about Jesus and His amazing sacrifice so that we can be saved from our sins and become members of God's family!

Hold up Session 4 Daily Plan Pennant. The cross reminds us that Jesus died on the cross and came back to life so that we can become members of God's family. Jesus loves us THAT MUCH! And that's the best news ever.
