
Jonah And The Whale



Then Jonah told them he was running away from God.






The sailors were terrified. "What must we do to make this storm cease?" they asked.

But the sailors did not want Jonah to die. They tried harder to row to shore, but the storm grew even worse.




Finally the sailors could row no more. Praying for forgiveness, they picked Jonah up and threw him overboard.


As Jonah walked through the city shouting his message, the people began to repent.

The people of Nineveh listened to Jonah's message. They listened to the words of the king. They began to fast and pray. They stopped their wicked ways.


Because the people repented, God decided not to destroy the city of Nineveh.
