On the fifth day of creation, God made birds that fly and sing.



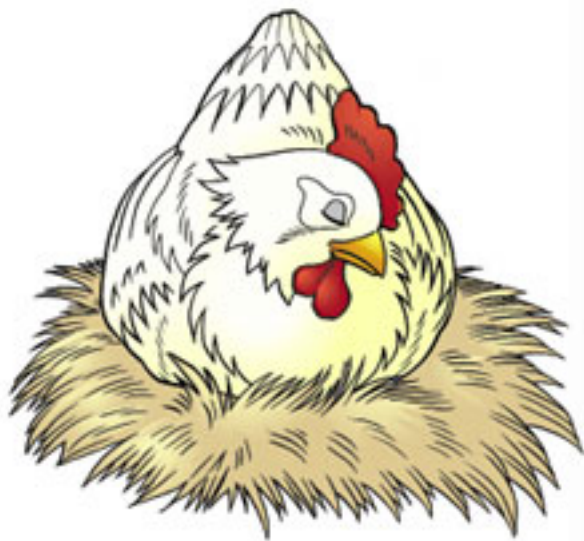
God made the red robin.
