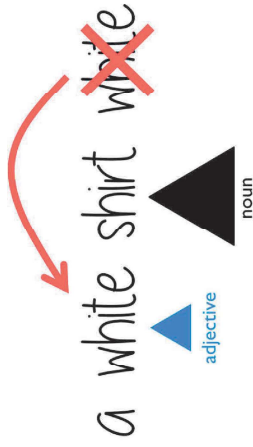


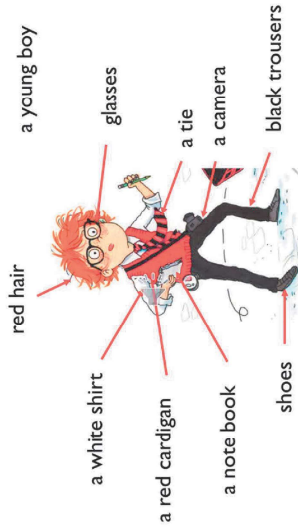
Structure :

En anglais, l'adjectif est toujours placé avant le nom.

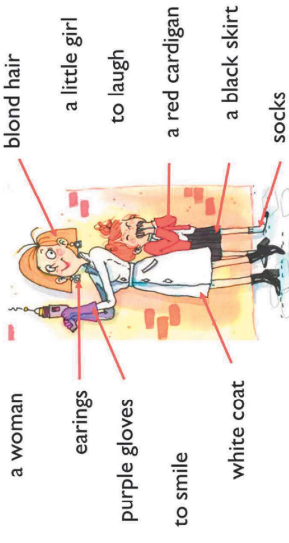


Vocabulary :
