God Gives Us Jesus

Materials: None. *Preparation*: None.

Characters

Zechariah (zehk-uh-RI-uh): Priest in God's Temple

Angel: Messenger from God **Elizabeth:** Zechariah's wife

Narrator

Scene One: God's Temple

Zechariah: (Enters.) What an honor it is to serve God in His Temple! Now then, where is that incense? (Angel enters.) Wait a minute! Who are you?

Angel: I am an angel of the Lord, Zechariah. I have a message from God.

Zechariah: You know, I was just telling Elizabeth that in our boring village nothing happens.

Now, I meet a CRAZY person!

Angel: I am not a crazy person, Zechariah. I am an ANGEL of the LORD. I repeat: I have a message for you from God. Do you want to hear it or not?

Zechariah: Sure. I have nothing to lose. Go ahead crazy person—I mean, ANGEL. What's the message?

Angel: The Lord has heard the prayer that you and your wife, Elizabeth, have been praying for many years. God is going to give you a son.

Zechariah: Hold it! Don't go any further. I know you're not an angel. That bit's been done before.

Angel: I beg your pardon?

Zechariah: Does the name Abraham mean anything to you? He was very old and so was Sarah, but God promised to give them a son.

Angel: AND?

Zechariah: Well now. That's called a miracle. Something that only happens ONCE. God already did that one.

Angel: What makes you think a miracle can only happen once?

Zechariah: Well, if something happens again and again, it's hardly unusual. It's natural. And miracles are SUPERnatural.

Angel: How long ago did this miracle happen to Abraham?

Zechariah: Well, I'm not sure. About two thousand years ago?

Angel: Do you call something that happens once every two thousand years COMMONplace?

Zechariah: Well, no . . .

Angel: Then PLEASE stop interrupting me and let me get on with the message. (Formally.) Ahem. You will have a son and you will name him John. He will speak with spirit and power to prepare the people to meet the Lord.

Zechariah: (Pause.) I must admit, that is some message. (Awed, imagining.) My son—a great prophet and preacher! But there's still the problem of my age—and Elizabeth's. How can I be SURE you're an angel? What if I tell everybody I'll have a son and three years later . . . nothing? People will say, "That's crazy old Zechariah who talks to ANGELS." No, I think I'll hold off on the birth announcements for a while.

Angel: Don't worry—you will not be making any birth announcements. As a sign to you that what I say is, indeed, a message from

God, from this moment until all these things have happened, you will not be able to speak. (Angel exits.)

Narrator: And at that moment, Zechariah became mute. He could not utter a word, not even when he returned home. (Zechariah exits.)

Scene Two: Zechariah's house

riah enters a moment later.) Hello, my husband. Did you have a nice day at work? (Pause.) What's the matter? (Zechariah pretends to write something.) Oh, we're going to play a guessing game! OKAY, you're writing something. A book. This is the name of a book. No? A writer. That's it. You're a writer. No? You're not very good at this game. (Pause.) Wait! This ISN'T a guessing game. You want to write something and you need a pen and paper. Well, why didn't you say so? Speak up, man. What is it? (Zechariah exits with Elizabeth following and still talking.) Why do you want a pen and paper? Just tell me what's going on!

Narrator: The angel Gabriel visited others besides Zechariah.

Scene Three: Mary's house

Angel: (Enters and speaks as if to Mary.) Fear not, Mary, for you have found great favor with God. I am the angel Gabriel and I have been sent to bring you good news. You will bear a child and shall name Him Jesus.

Narrator: Bubbling with excitement, Mary went to visit her relative Elizabeth.

Scene Four: Zechariah's house

Elizabeth: (Enters, pretends to open a door. Speaks as if to someone on the other side of the door.) **Hello, Mary.** I'm so glad to have a visitor. That husband of mine hasn't said a word for six months! But

you don't have to tell me why you're here. I know! You're going to have a baby, too. A baby specially blessed by God. And, Mary, the baby inside me jumped for joy when I heard your voice. What did Joseph have to say about all this? Come inside and tell me all about it. Let me help you with your bags. (Exits through pretend door.)

Narrator: Mary stayed with Elizabeth for about three months. In the meantime, God made SURE that Joseph would believe what Mary told him.

Scene Four: Joseph's house

Angel: (Enters and speaks as if to Joseph.) Joseph! I am an angel of the Lord. Do not be afraid to take Mary to be your wife. The child inside her is from God. This baby will be a boy, and you shall name Him Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins.

Narrator: Soon, Elizabeth's child was born.

Yes, we're excited and so pleased. (Pause.) We're going to name him John. (Zechariah enters. Elizabeth turns to him.) Zechariah, our friends think it's strange that we're naming the baby John. Please tell them, Zechariah. (Sighs again.) I mean, WRITE for them. Everyone look. (She points over Zechariah's shoulder as he writes.) He's writing, "His...name...is...John."

Zechariah: At last! I can speak again! Praise God! It's just as the angel said it would be! God is sending us a Savior, and this child will prepare His way!

Elizabeth: (Shrugs.) Well, there goes the peace and quiet.
