Te Araroa's Trail Towns – a guide to the logistics of tramping Te Araroa in the South Island including transport, accommodation and resupply.

Using this guide - this guide contains useful information to assist trampers getting on and off Te Araroa in the South Island. To complete the information kit Te Araroa trampers should generally also carry the track notes (see <u>teararoa.org.nz/thetrail</u>) and topographical map relevant to the section they are walking.

This guide contains 5 sections, each based on a geographical area, that follow sequentially from north to south. All distances are measured in kilometers from Ship Cove in the Marlborough Sounds, Te Araroa's start point in the South Island.

The services available in trail towns are grouped and follow the same pattern: General Information; Getting There/Away; Post Office; Accommodation; Resupply; Restaurants/Cafes; Transport to Trailheads; Outdoor Gear; Health; and Other. Not all towns offer all services so inevitably there are gaps in the services available at numerous points.

Visitor Information Centre's are included under the **General Information** heading and provide multipurpose tourist services including accommodation and transport bookings. Department of Conservation (DOC) visitor centres are also included here. They're often a good place to seek up to date information on Te Araroa within the local conservancy, to buy maps, hire locator beacons and make other tramping related purchases.

Neither the Trust nor the author endorse or rank businesses by inclusion or omission from this guide, which has been written independently to enable trampers to plan and hike in the manner that suits. No notice has been given or permission sought from any business listed.

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the information provided as at the date of publication but, be aware, things may change by the time you encounter them. If you're able, please do report changes to the author for inclusion in the next addition.

Where possible, a range of options are included under the **Accommodation** headings but the lists are in not intended to be all encompassing. If your preferred accommodation provider is full then its staff may be able to assist in finding alternative accommodation. Otherwise, there is the visitor information centre, if you are in a town that has one. Prices fluctuate both between and within the different accommodation categories and are susceptible to change so they aren't included. Typically though prices for:

- Hostels start at \$18.00 per night for a dorm room in less-touristy areas and are more expensive in other areas, as are double or sole occupancy rooms. Some hostels have rooms with private bathroom facilities but the norm is shared bathrooms and kitchen facilities. Both YHA and BBH options are included where they exist. All YHA hostels are on the association's web site and note the process for qualifying for its law carbon traveler discount at what is a what is a
- *Motels* with self contained facilities range from \$90.00 to around \$160.00 per night for single/double occupancy.
- *Camping Grounds* are also included and can range in cost from \$5.00 per site to \$42.00 per site (2 people), so for the cost conscious may or may not compare favourably with hostel accommodation.

Most accommodation providers have *laundry* facilities available for guests but a moderate fee often applies. The *internet* too is widely available and, again, a fee will often apply.

When it comes to **resupply** this guide includes the most convenient supermarket/general store options and, with careful planning, it's possible to tramp Te Araroa's full length in the South Island relying on them without recourse to mail drops, bounce boxes, or other assistance. To achieve this in some

sections, however, requires pre-arranged transport or hitch hiking. This is the case for both food and *fuel* - particularly if using meth's (denatured alcohol) stoves, which is readily available in supermarkets, general stores and service stations. Other fuels are less common and may require some searching out. Canisters containing propane mix are reliably available in Picton, Nelson, St Arnaud, Hamner Springs, Arthur's Pass, Twizel, Wanaka, Queenstown, Te Anau and Invercargill but don't expect to find them elsewhere along the trail unless you've confirmed this in advance.

Hitching is not recommended for solo female trampers but is a realistic option for others. Patience though may be required while waiting for a ride.

For those who prefer certainty in their resupply arrangements then pre-arranged *mail drops* and/or *bounce boxes* provide an alternative option. In this regard, trampers may ask accommodation providers whether they'll hold packages pending arrival and stay. In future editions we may compile a list of business who do accept mail drops (and on what terms) so if you use this resupply method then your advice would be appreciated.

New Zealand Post also offers a limited *Poste Restante* service for posting and receiving parcels to designated post offices. The only post offices of potential relevance to Te Araroa trampers in the South Island are in Picton, Greymouth Christchurch, Dunedin, Wanaka, Queenstown and Invercargill. The contact details of each of these post offices are included below apart for the Christchurch Post Office (736 Colombo St, post code, 8011, ph 03 377 5411, open Mon-Fri 8.30am -5.3 pm, Sat 10am - 2 pm) and the Dunedin Post Office (243 Princes St, post code, ph 03 477 3518, open Mon-Fri 8.30am - 5.30pm).

Parcels less than 2 kg will be held free of charge for the first seven days and thereafter at the rate of \$2.50 per week. Parcels between 2 and 30 kg are charged at \$2.50 per week. You can redirect from one Poste Resante location to another within New Zealand for an additional \$7.00 fee (for up to three months). You cannot redirect Poste Resante mail to other locations.

Sports outfitter stores are included under **Outdoor Gear** headings and you should be able to obtain most replacement items in any town that has a listing. Outside of Nelson, Christchurch, Queenstown and Dunedin however the range of specialist equipment can be limited. Picton, Wanaka and Invercargill are probably the best stocked of the remaining towns. Alternatively, if you have the time, purchasing online is an option. All of the major chains have well stocked online stores and can ship gear to you at any address.

A final word on **methods of payment**, almost all businesses accept Visa and MasterCard and some accept other credit cards as well. Debit cards are also very widely used via eftpos machines and ATMs and many businesses will allow cash, in addition to payment for goods and services, to be drawn down from debit accounts. While cash only businesses are rare it's wise to carry a certain amount (perhaps around \$150.00) to cover anything unforeseen. There are ATM's in a number of trail towns including Picton, Havelock, Lake Tekapo, Twizel, Wanaka, Queenstown, Te Anau and Invercargill.

Have a good tramp.
