
EGYPT: YOUR BUDGET = 1,000 euros per person

SOME USEFUL DISTANCES:

- Cairo city centre to Giza (pyramids) = 7 km
- Cairo to Luxor = 720 km
- Cairo to Aswan = 982 km
- Cairo to Abu Simbel = 1260 km

- <u>1. Help exchanges</u>: You can invent one.
- 2. <u>Couchsurfing</u>: You can invent a person/ situation to live in.
- <u>3.</u> <u>Basic Hostel:</u> €8 per person per night. You will only be able to stay in a basic hostel in a <u>town</u>, not in the countryside
- <u>4.</u> <u>Average Hotel/Hostel:</u> €17 per person per night.

5. Luxury Hotel: €60 per person per night or more
