

SOME – ANY – NO

SOME et **ANY** indiquent une certaine quantité ou un certain nombre.
Devant un nom, ils sont **DÉTERMINANT**.

Phrases AFFIRMATIVES

☞ **SOME** → *de, du, des*

some



J'ai de l'argent.

Phrases NEGATIVES

☞ **ANY** → *pas de, aucun*

any



Je n'ai pas d'argent.

- There is some ice in the fridge.
Il y a de la glace dans le réfrigérateur.

- There isn't any milk in the fridge.
Il n'y a pas de lait dans le réfrigérateur.

Phrases INTERROGATIVES

OFFRE ou DEMANDE POLIE

☞ **SOME**



*- Voulez-vous du café ?
(on sait qu'il y a du café)*

VRAIE QUESTION

☞ **ANY**



*- As-tu de l'argent ?
(on ne sait pas s'il a de l'argent ou non)*

- Can I have some soup, please ?
*Est-ce que je peux avoir de la soupe,
s'il vous plaît ?*

- Is there any ice in the fridge ?
*Est-ce qu'il y a de la glace dans le
réfrigérateur ?*

NONE → **NOT ANY** + nom = **NO** + nom



The car park is empty. *Le parking est vide.*

There **aren't any** cars.

Il n'y a pas de voitures.

There **are no** cars.

How many cars are there in the car park?

None.

Aucune.

Employés seuls, ils sont **PRONOMS** = ils remplacent un nom, ou groupe nominal.

Is there **any** milk in the fridge ?
Y a-t-il du lait dans le frigo?

Yes, there is **some**.
Oui, il y en a.

I like fruit. Can I have **any** ?
J'aime les fruits. Puis-je en avoir?

Les composés de **SOME – ANY - NO**

personnes		choses		lieux	
someone somebody	<i>quelqu'un</i>	something	quelque chose	somewhere	quelque part
anyone anybody	<i>quelqu'un</i> <i>personne</i> <i>(négative)</i>	anything	quelque chose rien (nég)	anywhere	quelque part nulle part (nég)
no one nobody	<i>personne</i>	nothing	rien	nowhere	nulle part

Is there **anyone** at the door?
Y a-t-il quelqu'un à la porte?

Yes, there is **someone** at the door.
Oui, il y a quelqu'un à la porte.

No, there isn't **anyone** at the door.
Non, il n'y a personne à la porte.

No, there is **no one** at the door.
Non, il n'y a personne à la porte.
