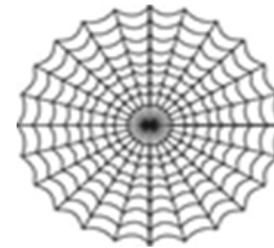


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Word of the day : Halloween

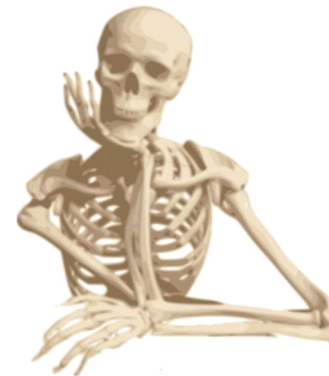
a skeleton /'skɛlɪt(ə)n/
