Jesus Helps a Young Girl and a Sick Woman

Materials: Microphone, two business cards.

Preparation: Hand microphone to Cindy-Sue. Hand business cards to lack.

Characters

Cindy-Sue Saddleshoo: Pushy TV reporter **Jackie T. Carbunkle:** Ambulance-chasing lawyer

Witness 1: Woman on the street
Witness 2: Man on the street

Scene: Outside a home in Galilee. A large crowd has gathered.

Cindy-Sue: (Holding microphone, speaks to audience as if to a camera.) I'm Cindy-Sue Saddleshoo, ace reporter for Galilee TV News. For those of you just joining us, there's a sick young girl in this house. Her father is the synagogue ruler, Jairus. He has gone to ask Jesus, the famous teacher and healer, to help her.

Jack: (Pushes his way through crowd.) **Excuse me! Pardon** me! **Important lawyer . . . gotta get through!**

Cindy-Sue: (Pushes microphone in Jack's face.) **Sir, wait! What's your name? Are you the sick girl's lawyer?**

Jack: (To audience as if to camera.) **Jackie T. Carbunkle,** attorney-at-law. Hurt your back? Just call Jack!

Cindy-Sue: (To Jack.) **Tell me, Mr. Carbunkle, how is** your client feeling?

Jack: Well if you must know, she isn't my client yet! But I heard she's nearly dead, and I'm here to make sure she knows her rights! (Sees Witness 1. Hands her a business card.) Jackie T. Carbunkle, attorney-at-law. Slip 'n fall? Gimme a call!

Witness 1: Well, I'm not hurt, but I was sick for years! I went to doctor after doctor, and no one could help me.

Jack: (Excited.) Really? I can make sure you never have to worry about doctor bills again!

Witness 1: But that's the thing—I'm not sick like I used to be.

Cindy-Sue: (To audience.) You heard it here first!

The sick woman is now . . . (Looks at Witness 1.)

Sicker? (Witness 1 shakes her head.) Help me out, then! What happened?

Witness 1: Well, I heard that Jesus was in the area. And I knew that He has healed many people. I knew He could heal me, too!

Cindy-Sue: (To audience.) Aha! So this brave woman marched right up to Jesus, and He healed her!

Witness 1: Well, not exactly . . . Jesus was on His way here to see this young girl. There were crowds all around Him. But I thought, if I can just touch the hem of His robe, I'll be healed.

Cindy-Sue: (*To audience.*) Another tragic story of illness making people delusional. (*To* Witness 1.) So what made you think clothing can heal?

Witness 1: I didn't think His ROBE would heal me . . . I believed that because Jesus is so powerful, even touching His robe would save me. And I knew the crowd would never let me in if they knew I was sick. So I quietly slipped through the crowd and touched Jesus' robe.

- **Jack:** (Excited.) So did the crowd get angry? Were you injured?
- Witness 1: Not at all. Jesus stopped and asked who had touched Him. I was terrified! But I admitted I had touched His robe. Jesus was so kind and patient that He said because of my faith, I was healed!
- **Jack:** (Disappointed.) Well, if you start to feel sick again, call me.
- Witness 1: I won't! I'm all better. I'm right as rain! Healthy as a horse! My friends and family won't believe it! I'm on my way home right now to tell them all about Jesus and how He helped me. (Witness 1 exits.)
- Cindy-Sue: (Witness 2 enters as Cindy-Sue is speaking to audience.) For those of you just joining us, on Jesus' way to heal a young girl, a sick woman sneaked through the crowd, touched Jesus' robe and was healed!
- **Jack:** (Sees Witness 2. Hands him a business card.) **Jackie T.** Carbunkle, attorney-at-law. Is your donkey broke? I'm your bloke!
- Witness 2: Actually, I don't have a donkey. I just know that when the young girl died—
- **Cindy-Sue:** She's dead?! (To audience.) What a tragic turn of events! You heard it here first, folks. The sick girl is now dead.
- **Witness 2:** No, no. You don't understand. She WAS dead, but she isn't anymore!
- **Cindy-Sue:** (To audience.) You heard it here first, folks! The dead girl is now just sick!
- Jack: Hold on! Is she sick or is she dead?
- Witness 2: She was sick. Then she was dead. Now she isn't sick or dead.

Cindy-Sue: (To Jack.) How do you think this will affect your case?

- **Jack:** I'm not sure. But I'll definitely look into it. (To Witness 2.) So what happened with the girl?
- Witness 2: When the girl died, I went to get Jairus. I told him the girl had died. So Jairus and Jesus hurried here. But Jesus said that the girl wasn't really dead. She was only sleeping.
- **Cindy-Sue:** So Jesus was confused?
- Witness 2: No! He meant that He could still heal her—even from death! He went inside the house. She was lying on her bed, dead. But I hear that Jesus told her to get up, and she DID! She was completely healthy!
- Cindy-Sue: (To audience.) You heard it here first, live on Galilee TV News! Jesus healed Jairus's daughter AND a sick woman, all in one day. This is Cindy-Sue Saddleshoo. Goodnight. (Pauses for a moment, smiling widely and then exits.)
- **Jack:** (Disappointed.) So you mean to tell me that there are NO sick people here? (Witness 2 shakes his head, no.) And NO dead people? (Witness 2 shakes his head, no.) And nobody is even injured?
- **Witness 2:** Well, it looks like you're not needed here.
- Jack: (Excited.) That's alright. While I'm down this way, I'm going to talk to some fishermen.

 (Witness 2 and Jack exit, as Jack continues talking.) They want to sue the mayor because they didn't catch any fish all day! And one of them says he got seasick...
