



The members of the club met on two Sundays at the Mauritius Gymkhana Club, Vacoas, in spite of the winter hitting hard. These were real moments of friendship, joy and engagement in shaping the contours and drawing the roadmap of our new, revamped, rejuvenated, re-born Rotary Club.

The list of endorsed priorities was presented as:



Rotarians sensitized on swine flu

Dr.Kevin Teerovanengadum,a young & dynamic Specialist from Victoria Hospital, sensitized Rotaractors & Rotarians on the spread of Swine Flu. The HINI virus initially originated from Mexico & spread out to the world. Mauritius is now being seriously affected with already 4 cases of death recorded. As vaccinations have not yet reached the Mauritian market, preventative measures are to be enforced to prevent swine flu spread.

It is to be noted that this virus can be caught at school, workplace or even home if u come into a contact of less than 2 metres with an infected patient. It would take 24 hours for the symptoms to develop. Infected patients would suffer among of fever, sore threat, cough, body ache, runny noise, headache & even tiredness.



Although nobody is safe, but these vulnerable groups should be extra careful:

- 1. Children under 4 years old
- 2. Pregnant women
- 3. Elders of 65 years & more
- 4. Dialysis patients
- 5. People suffering from cancer, lung, heart, kidney and other diseases

Some precautionary measures include:

- Cut out on Business Trips
- Distribute information brochures to all your staff.
- Ensure that washing bassin is fitted with tissues and soap
- Maintain good ventilation
- Be aware, but not afraid


