He was halfway to town when a man stopped him.

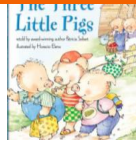
« I will give you five magic beans for your cow. »

Cinderella (2)

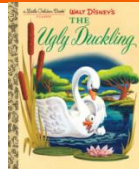
One day, Cinderella's family received an invitation to a ball. The prince was having a dance and inviting all of the young women in the kingdom.

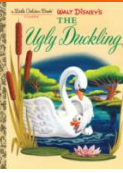
The Ugly duckling (1)

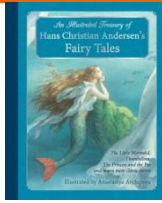


The little red riding hood (2)

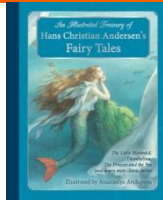
The little mermaid (1)

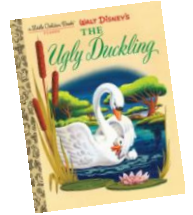
