
What Joshua And Caleb Saw




God told Moses that it was time for the children of Israel to go to the good land He had promised their ancestors.

"Choose twelve men to spy out the land," God said.




The twelve men went to Canaan and saw how well everything grew.


The cows were fat, the corn tall and the gardens were full of fruit trees and hives of bees.

Two men carried bunches of grapes, on a branch, to show Moses.




But when the spies saw the big walls of the city they were scared and said, "We could never live in this land!
The people will be too strong and will fight us."




They went back and told Moses all they had seen.
