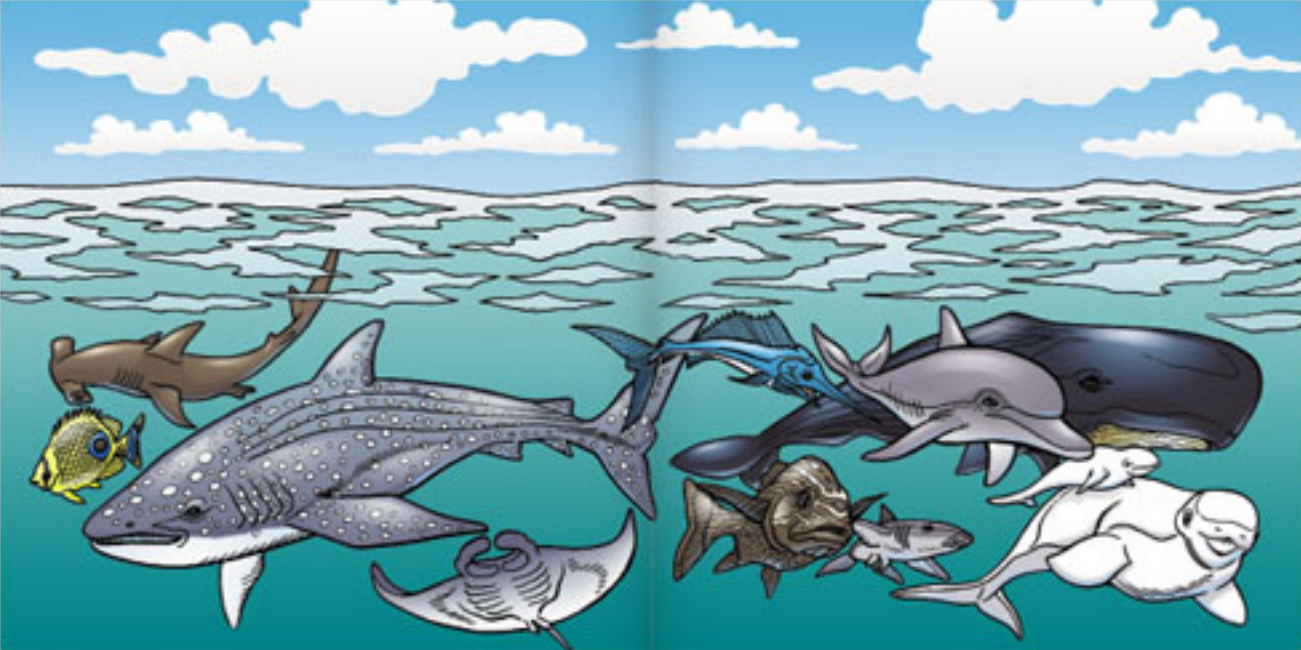

God made colorful fish that live in coral reefs.

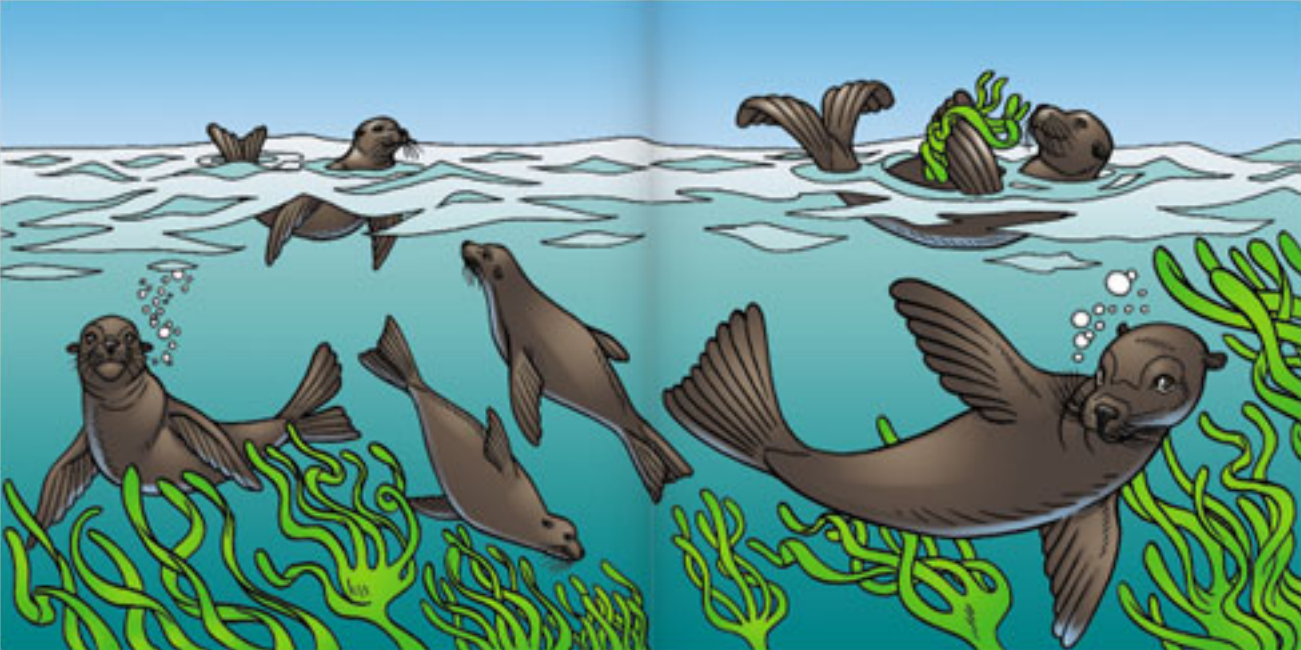


They breathe with their gills and swim in groups called schools.

They breathe with lungs and have a blow hole. They swim in groups called pods.



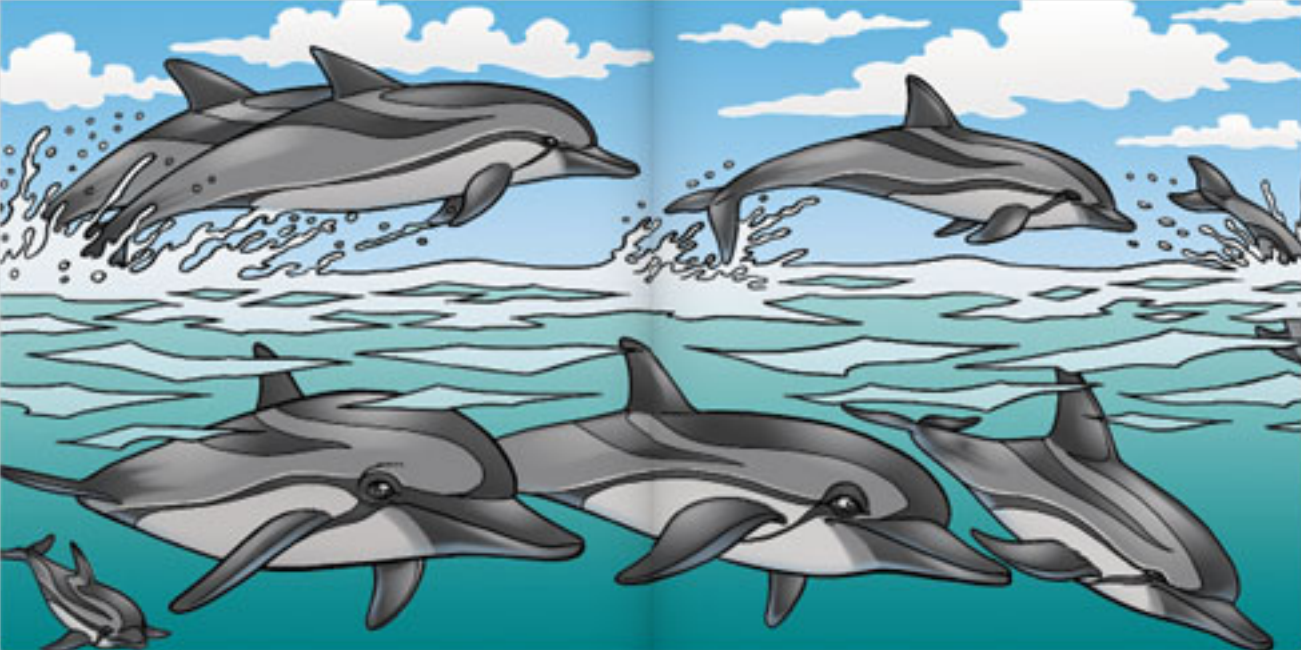
God made the brown sea otters. They play and sleep in the kelp beds.

They also have lungs and must come up for air. They are excellent swimmers and divers.



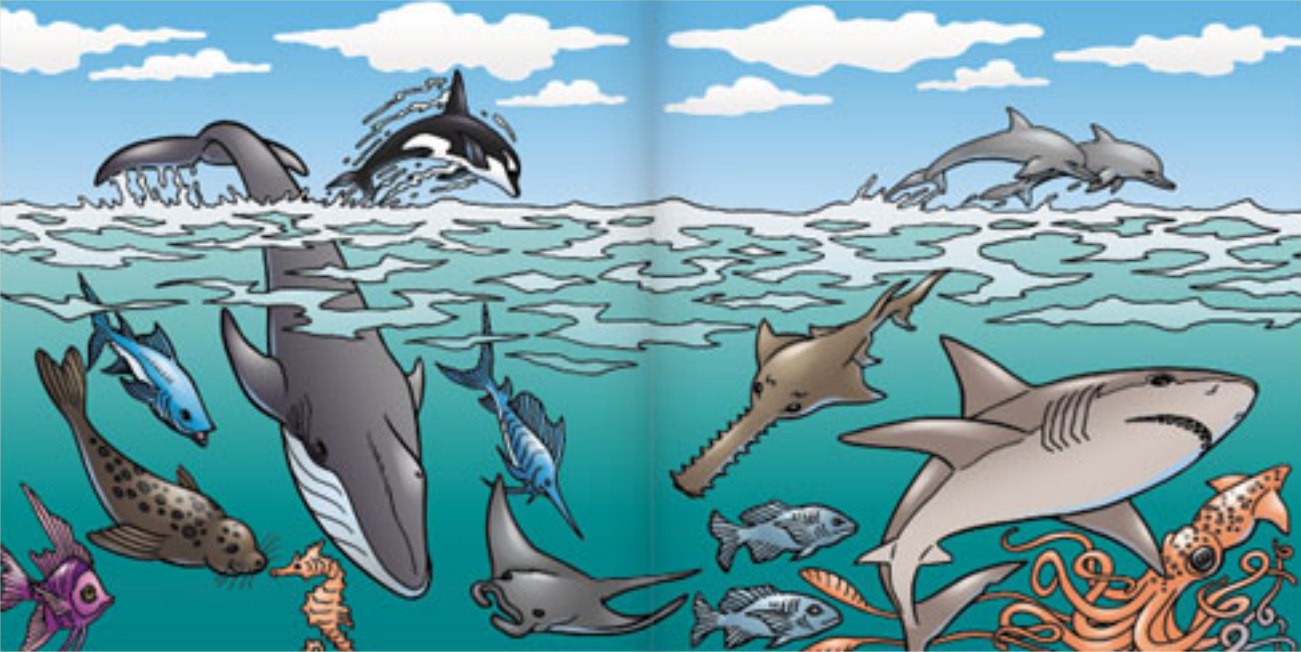
God made the funny hermit crab. It lives in the empty shell of a snail. When it gets too big for its shell, it finds
